Trivia answer

The first production Big Block V-8 Chevrolet engine was the "Single U" series, released in 1958 in passenger car & trucks with 348 cubic inch displacement. This engine was an overhead valve design with offset valves and unique scalloped rocker covers, giving it a distinctive appearance. The "W" series was produced from 1958-1965, with three displacements offered: 348 cubic inches (5.7 L), available from 1958-1961 in cars and 1958-1964 in trucks; 409 cubic inches (6.702 L), available from 1961-1965; and 427 cubic inches (6.9973 L), available in 1962 & 1963. Many are unaware that Chevrolet's first ever V-8 engine was produced from 1917-1919. At 288 cubic inches, it too was substantial for it's time.
